Minister's Letter

Dear friends,

The Manse 64 Brantingham Road, Manchester

Perhaps late to the party, but I have just begun watching 'Detectorists', the BBC comedy series starring Mackenzie Crook and Toby Jones about 'the lives, loves and metal-detecting ambitions of Andy and Lance'. I'm not far through, and so far they have only really found some old dinky toy cars. Please don't spoil it for me, but I am hopeful they'll find something more substantial.

Our new President and Vice-President of Conference (Rev Gill Newton and Deacon Kerry Scarlett) have announced their theme for the coming year as 'Hidden Treasure'. In her inaugural address, Rev Gill spoke of her hope for the church (both the people and the institution). 'The treasure that God has hidden for us is waiting to be discovered and used, not hidden away in a museum or a cabinet only to be used on special occasions or buried again for others to find.'*

As we go through the process of merging the Didsbury and East Didsbury churches there is plenty of hidden 'treasure' to be found. Old papers and documents. Chairs hidden away in the cellar. Craft materials saved from a time when there had been a thriving Sunday School. More chalices. More crosses. Dozens of mismatched plates. Some of our treasures remain useful; some have been a delight to rediscover after years unused; some are, I'm afraid, rotten with misuse and worth nothing to anyone.

We have a choice: keep, or dispose (be it to a charity shop or the bin). Not everything can be kept: hoarding is not the best use of treasure. Besides, there cannot be space for it all. Conversely, we cannot throw everything away without due consideration: that is an irresponsible approach to our assets. It's not easy, is it? It is often only when there is a threat that something will be taken away that we realise how precious items are. Any couple that marry bring all their stuff and combine it in one house... and then discover what *they* think is important may not be what their *partner* does. Somehow, in the midst of all the to-ing and fro-ing, a compromise has to be made, however painful that may be. For us, too, there will be painful moments, but together we can carry each other through this process of grief and rebuilding.

Echoing Rev Gill's words, the Church is not a museum, nor a storage cabinet. It is not only for Sundays, high days and holidays, nor is it a hiding place.

No, the Church is the living, breathing people of God.

You.

It is a treasure waiting to be discovered and used.

You are God's treasure, of far more worth than any physical object in our church buildings, and eternally loved by God. Hold on to that promise, that for God 'X' marks the spot where you are.


